Good framing will enhance the artwork.Bad framing can spoil a great piece.Poor quality framing is potentially dangerous.


Frame Considerations

We DO NOT accept plastic frames, frames from IKEA, or unfinished frames (bare wood without paint/varnish).

We have had pieces fall and break because of cheap and weak frames. It is important to choose a frame with quality construction.


All framed works must have a wire

Pieces will be hung from hooks in our studio. They must be held up by wire and with hardware strong enough to support the weight and to withstand an accidental bump.




Framing Guide by Artwork Type


1. Flat work on paper



2. Painting on canvas



3. Relief sculpture (raised surface)



Mat Considerations

Mat is required for all flat works on paper to separate the artwork from the glass. This prevents damage to the art.

The visible surface of the mat should not be less than 1" on any edge.

Do not "float" artwork by excluding mat or by leaving space between artwork and mat.
